



### **Donations**





**Building For Our Future** - Donations to this fund support areas in the hospital in greatest need. Monies given to support Manager's Wish List Items and Equipment Technology Upgrades.

The Foundation Board chose to support the purchase of Surgery Sterile Processing Equipment. Sterile processing technology and equipment has revolutionized the way hospitals and surgical centers control healthcare-associated infections. Sterile processing technicians use this equipment to sterilize surgical instruments, which helps to minimize negative patient outcomes such as increased mortality rates, lengthy hospital stays, and health care costs.

All About Me Cancer Resources - Gifts to this fund provide grants and resources to qualified cancer patients at Rochelle Community Hospital so they can better manage their road to recovery. In 2019-2020, The RCH Foundation awarded nine \$500 scholarships to cancer patients in need from our service area.

### COVID-19 Comes to RCH

The arrival of the COVID-19 virus pandemic in the United States in early January 2020 greatly impacted hospitals across the nation, including Rochelle Community Hospital.

By mid-March, cases were beginning to increase in Ogle County and at Rochelle Community Hospital. Fortunately, RCH stays current with emergency preparedness training in our county and in our region. In November of 2019 we participated in a state-wide pandemic drill facilitated by the Illinois Health & Hospital Association. This knowledge helped us to respond quickly to the changing demands for equipment, materials and personnel. We bolstered our supply of personal protective equipment (PPE), introduced a COVID-19 Triage Line, implemented laboratory testing, prepared inpatient rooms, restricted visitation and elective surgical procedures, increased precautions and educated our community about COVID-19 signs, symptoms, testing, etc.

Rochelle Community Hospital partnered with the Ogle County Health Department, City of Rochelle and many other community partners to coordinate our efforts in responding to this healthcare crisis. By March 23, 2020, the Ogle County Emergency Operations Center (EOC) in downtown Rochelle was activated at Level 1 with assistance from the Illinois Emergency Management Association (IEMA). Rochelle Community Hospital was represented at the EOC and participated in all the briefings. Twice weekly meetings were held until the EOC was reduced to partial activation on August 10, 2020. Weekly RCH Incident Command meetings continue to take place.

This included a parade of well-wishers supporting healthcare workers in our community organized by the City of Rochelle on May 12, during Hospital Week. We have been truly humbled by the community's response.

At this writing of September 1, 2020, we are still battling the pandemic but hope is on the horizon with a vaccine in the final stages of development. Our lives have been forever changed.
