Fast Response Saves First Responder

STROKE CARE TEAM PROVIDES SPEEDY, COMPASSIONATE CARE WHEN IT MATTERS MOST

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When it comes to stroke care, time is of the essence. Healthcare providers must be quick-thinking and attentive in recognizing and diagnosing stroke symptoms — and providing much-needed care but must also do so in a manner that's calming and comforting to patients.

Serving more than three decades as a first responder, lifelong Rochelle resident Brian Johnson understood the importance of both efficiency and compassion when it came to emergency care. But on a cold, winter night in 2013, he experienced firsthand just how important these qualities are.

Brian, a 34-year veteran and retired chief of the Rochelle Fire Department, doesn't remember much about the events of January 31, 2013. In those early morning hours, his wife, Dawn, was awakened to the sound of Brian falling out of their bed. Unable to speak and with no motor function in his right side, Dawn immediately recognized he had suffered a stroke and called 911, after which he was transported by ambulance to the Rochelle Community Hospital Emergency Department.

"When I got there, the attitude was really good. They were taking care of me right away," Brian said. "Carri White, RN took care of me and she was next to my side most of the time during all the procedures. Dr. Christopher Berg was in the room right away, and of course, he knew what the stroke was. So, as soon as Carri was done doing the vitals and all that, they took me to the CT scan right away to see what was going on in my brain."

Imaging revealed Brian had suffered
a stroke on the left side of his brain
— by the time he arrived at Rochelle
Community Hospital, the clot was gone.

Acting quickly, the stroke team transferred him to a hospital in Winfield after less than an hour, Brian said.

"I was probably there for like 40 minutes. They didn't waste time getting me to the right place," Brian said. "So, they're pretty fast. Working as an EMT for 34 years, I took a lot of patients to the ER, so I knew the people — I was at ease. They were efficient. They didn't waste time. They took care of me."

Additionally, Brian said he was extremely grateful for the kind, empathetic care he received from Rochelle Community Hospital.

Brian said knowing he received compassionate care from people he knew helped put him at ease. "They knew me — that was one of the best things about it," he said. "I wasn't in a hospital where I didn't know anybody, so I had the same feeling other people have when you're at a smaller hospital like RCH. I just felt comfortable."

After completing rehabilitation in Rockford, Brian returned to work at the fire department until his



retirement in 2015. Though his speech and motor functions aren't quite at the level they were before the stroke, Brian said he's now doing very well.



Brian credits Rochelle Community Hospital and the efficient, compassionate emergency care with not only his personal wellness, but also the health, safety, and well-being of the community.

"During my shifts before as chief, when I came in there, the providers were taking care of critical patients right away," Brian said. "I'd have people come in there with severe injuries and their staff is on the scene right away. They know what's going on and they do the best they can. They know right away whether to keep the patient in Rochelle or transfer that person."

As a father of two — including a second-generation firefighter — and grandfather of five, Brian calls Rochelle Community Hospital a vital community service that he entrusts to care for his entire family.

"We would never bypass that hospital for any reason," Brian said. "They know what they're doing. They're vital to the community — no doubt about that."

Rochelle Community Hospital is the most trusted stroke care facility for patients in Ogle County. As an Acute Stroke Ready Hospital, our team is well equipped to diagnose and treat stroke patients with utmost compassion and care.

According to the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH), a hospital is designated as an Acute Stroke Ready Hospital when it is found to be providing emergent stroke care as identified by several requirements including:

- Must have an accredited laboratory
- Able to always provide brain image tests, including 24/7 CT scans
- Able to administer thrombolytic therapy or "clot busters" to dissolve blood clots
- Able to transfer to a primary or comprehensive stroke center with needed neurological capabilities

IDPH recognizes Acute Stroke Ready Hospitaldesignated hospitals and directs EMS services to these facilities when transporting stroke patients.

"Our designation as an Acute Stroke Ready Hospital means we're always prepared to provide top-notch care to stroke patients," said Rochelle Community Hospital CEO Gregg Olson. "We're honored to be a provider of choice for stroke patients in the state of Illinois and recognize this designation is a result of the hard work and dedication from our incredible healthcare providers to grow Rochelle Community Hospital's stroke readiness to all-new heights."

Designation as an Acute Stroke Ready Hospital ensures all stroke patients — regardless of where they live — have access to rapid care within the narrow treatment window. Prior to receiving this designation, patients would have had to travel a long distance to receive assistance, losing precious time. Acute Stroke Ready designation for Rochelle Community Hospital allows local access to the care needed beginning the moment a patient enters the hospital to the time the lifesaving drug is administered within the recommended 60-minute treatment window.

Rochelle Community Hospital first received state recognition as a designated stroke center in 2014 when it was named an Emergent Stroke Ready Hospital (ESRH). Since 2017, RCH has been recognized as an Acute Stroke Ready Hospital by IDPH.

A Springtime Seasonal Recipe



INGREDIENTS

Salsa:

- 2 sliced pineapples, each 1/2 inch thick, patted dry
- 1 cup strawberries, diced
- 1/4 cup finely chopped red onion
- 3 Tbsp. chopped, fresh mint leaves
- 1 tsp. sugar
- 1/8 tsp. crushed red pepper flakes
- 1/2 medium lemon

Chicken:

- 4 boneless, skinless chicken breast halves (about 4 ounces each), all visible fat discarded
- 2 tsp. salt-free steak seasoning blend
- 1/4 tsp. salt

DIRECTIONS

- Preheat the grill on medium. Brush your grill pan or grill rack with oil. Heat the grill pan or rack on the grill for about two minutes, or until hot. Grill the pineapple for two minutes on both sides. Transfer to a cutting board and let cool for about two minutes, before dicing.
- 2. In a medium bowl, stir the remaining salsa ingredients except the lemon. Grate one teaspoon lemon zest, reserving the lemon. Stir the zest and chopped pineapple into the strawberry mixture.
- 3. Sprinkle both sides of the chicken with the seasoning blend and salt. Grill for five minutes on each side, until no longer pink in the center. Transfer to plates. Squeeze the reserved lemon over the chicken. Serve with the salsa on the side.

On the Go

Need to complete a Department of Transportation (DOT) physical or a random drug screening? On the Go Healthcare Clinic is here for you.

Conveniently located inside the Petro Travel Plaza at 900 Petro Drive in Rochelle, On the Go keeps drivers on the road with services such as DOT physicals and recertification, employment physicals, TB skin testing and vaccines for employment, hearing tests, respiratory fitness and clearance evaluation, and workers' compensation care. DOT physicals are performed by certified medical examiners through the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA) who maintain ongoing competency with training, testing, certification, and recertification.

Appointments are needed for DOT physicals, though patients may be seen the same day. Most other services do not require an appointment. For more information or to schedule a DOT physical, call 815-561-1283.
