COMMUNITY HEALTH NEEDS ASSESSMENT AND IMPLEMENTATION STRATEGY

Establishing Health Priorities Reporting Document

Introduction

Rochelle Community Hospital (RCH) is a 25-bed critical access hospital (CAH) located in Rochelle, Illinois, within Ogle County.

RCH participated in Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA) services administrated by Rural Health Innovations (RHI), a subsidiary of the National Rural Health Resource Center (The Center). In September 2021, The Center conferred with leaders from RCH to discuss the objectives of a regional CHNA.

In February 2022, secondary data was collected. Focus groups and key stakeholder interviews were conducted in March. In April, report findings were presented via webinar, as well as a presentation highlighting national changes in the health care system. In July 2022, The Center facilitated inperson implementation planning with eighteen hospital leaders and community agency representatives to identify community health priorities and develop strategic actions.

Description of Community Served

Input was sought from the following counties that are within the service area: Ogle, Lee, and Henry.

Input from Broad Interests

In the September 2021 meeting with RHI, RCH decided that CHNA information would be aggregated by capturing secondary data, virtually conducting four focus groups, and eight key stakeholder interviews.

RCH provided names and contact information for 96 potential attendees. RHI reached out to all 96 to invite them to participate. Fifteen people signed up and thirteen attended. Attendees could choose the focus group they preferred to attend based on their availability. Each focus group included a mix of attendees representing their community. Attendees included seniors, representatives from businesses, health care consumers, and social services. Secondary data was presented and RHI staff facilitated discussion of questions identified by RCH. No identifiable information was disclosed to maintain confidentiality.

Fifteen residents were identified by the hospital to potentially participate in key stakeholder interviews. The key stakeholders were identified based on the various consumer groups of local health services including senior citizens, young parents, health care providers, and community leaders.

Nine stakeholders were interviewed. As with the focus groups, secondary data was presented and RHI staff facilitated discussion of questions identified by RCH. No identifiable information was disclosed to maintain confidentiality.

Prioritized Health Needs

On July 6, 2022, 18 members of the hospital leadership and community members from Sinnissippi Centers, Ogle County Health Department, and Rochelle Fire Department were assembled to:

- Explore findings from the CHNA high level overview
- Identify community health priorities based on the findings
- Participate in translating identified health priorities into actionable work

The participants met in-person for the implementation planning session. They worked as a group to identify the top community health needs to prioritize. Seven (7) potential priorities were identified:

- Improving Access to Behavioral Health Services
- Transportation
- Remove Barriers to Access of Care Services
- Provide Education and Screenings
- Involve At-Risk Populations
- Increase Programs Aimed at Youth
- Increase Wellness Through Education and Prevention

Each participant then had an opportunity to vote for the need(s) they felt was a top priority. The top health needs identified from the quantitative and qualitative data are:

- Improve Access to Behavioral Health Services
- Address Barriers to Accessing Care [The group decided that this
 priority will include transportation and barriers impacting at-risk
 populations, specifically the Hispanic community.]

These needs were then evaluated based on those that best relate to the hospital's mission, urgency, feasibility within the hospital's resources, existing community strengths, and opportunities to partner with other local organizations.

A facilitation method designed to achieve group consensus-based decisions that respects the diversity of participant perspectives, inspires individual action, and moves the group toward joint resolve and action was utilized. This method creates awareness about new relationships between data and acknowledges the level of the group's consensus at any given moment. The conversation is aimed towards identifying actions they can take towards addressing the community's top health needs identified.

Team members self-selected the priority they each wished to work on. The group members began by individually brainstorming potential actions to address their selected priority. Team members then shared their ideas in small groups and identified the top potential actions they wished to share with the full group.

The list of potential activities will be reviewed by hospital leadership and integrated with the hospital's strategic plan where applicable. Hospital leadership and community participants will then operationalize a plan of actions to address the identified health goal by completing the Community Health Needs Assessment Action Plan Worksheet.
